- A file will be created in Notepad. Save the file to somewhere where you will be able to easily find it again. (I usually save to my desktop temporarily).

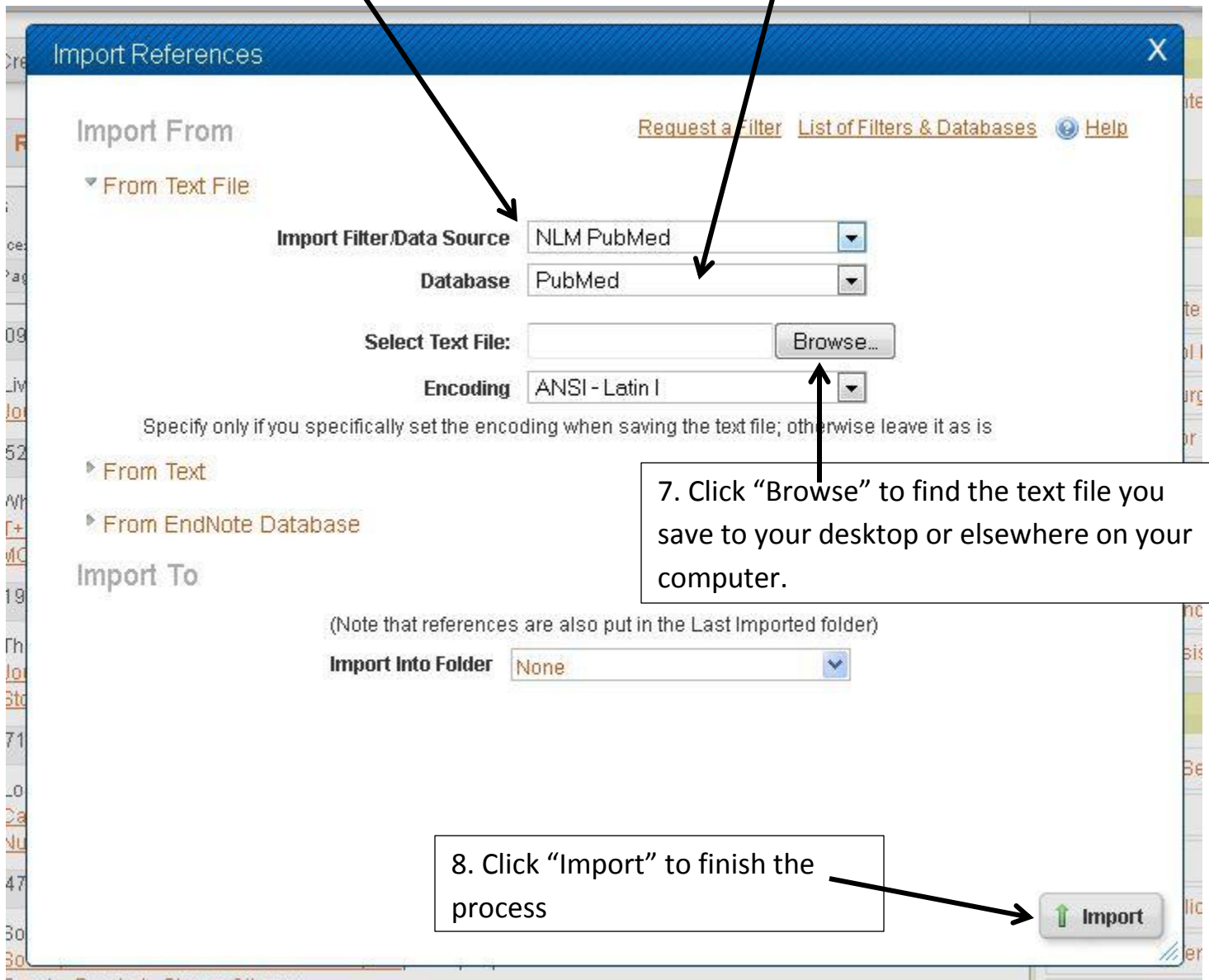
Log into **RefWorks** (refworks.com)

4. Click "Import" from either location.
